

HOLY WEEK

MARCH 25 | MONDAY OF HOLY WEEK

Holy Gospel: John 12:1-11

Prayer: Grant, we pray, almighty God, that, though in our weakness we fail, we may be revived through the Passion of your Only Begotten Son. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Do you know the love that knows no bounds? As Jesus dines with his beloved friends, Mary does something which only love can do. She took the most precious thing she had and spent it all on Jesus. Her love was not calculated but extravagant. Mary's action was motivated by one thing, and one thing only, namely, her love for Jesus and her gratitude for God's mercy. She did something, however, a Jewish woman would never do in public. She loosened her hair and anointed Jesus with her tears. It was customary for a woman on her wedding day to bind her hair. For a married woman to loosen her hair in public was a sign of grave immodesty. Mary was oblivious to all around her, except for Jesus. She took no thought for what others would think, but what would please her Lord. In humility, she stooped to anoint Jesus' feet and to dry them with her hair. How do you show your love for Christ?

MARCH 26 | TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK

Holy Gospel: John 13:21-33, 36-38

Prayer: Almighty ever-living God, grant us so to celebrate the mysteries of the Lord's Passion that we may merit to receive your pardon. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Satan entered into Judas when he rejected Jesus and left to pursue his evil course. Satan can twist love and turn it into hate. He can turn holiness into pride, discipline into cruelty, affection into complacency. We must always be on our guard against Satan, whose mission among the faithful is to turn us from the love of God and the path which God has chosen for us. The Holy Spirit will give us grace and strength each and every time that we are tested. If we submit to Jesus, we will walk in the light of his truth and love. If we turn our backs on him we will stumble and fall in the ways of sin and darkness. Are you ready to follow Jesus in his way of the cross? Or do you run away from the cross of Christ?

MARCH 27 | WEDNESDAY OF HOLY WEEK

Holy Gospel: Matthew 26:14-25

Prayer: O God, who willed your Son to submit for our sake to the yoke of the Cross, so that you might drive from us the power of the enemy, grant us, your servants, to attain the grace of the resurrection. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Jesus knew beforehand what would befall him. As Jesus ate the Passover meal with his twelve apostles, he put them under trial and suspicion (one of you will betray me) to teach them to examine themselves rightly, to avoid thinking of themselves as being more strong than they were. We, also must examine ourselves in the light of God's truth and grace and ask him to strengthen us in faith, hope, and love that we may not fail him or forsake him when we are tempted. When you pray (The Lord's Prayer, the Our Father) do the words simply roll off your tongue without much thought? Or do you pray mindfully and with confidence in the words Jesus gave us to pray? Do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil (Matthew 6:13).

MARCH 28 | HOLY THURSDAY

Holy Gospel: John 13:1-15

Prayer: O God, who have called us to participate in this most sacred Supper, in which your Only Begotten Son, when about to hand himself over to death, entrusted to the Church a sacrifice new for all eternity, the banquet of his love, grant, we pray, that we may draw from so great a mystery, the fullness of charity and of life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Does your love waver when you encounter bitter disappointments and injury from others? As Jesus' hour of humiliation draws near, he reveals to his disciples the supreme humility which shaped the love he had for them. He stoops to perform a menial task reserved for servants - the washing of smelly, dirty feet. In stooping to serve his disciples, Jesus knew he would be betrayed by one of them and that the rest would abandon him through disloyalty. Such knowledge could have easily led to bitterness or hatred. Jesus met the injury of betrayal and disloyalty with the greatest humility and supreme love. Jesus loved his disciples to the very end, even when they failed him and forsook him. The Lord loves each of us unconditionally. His love has power to set us free to serve others with Christ-like compassion and humility. Does the love of Christ rule in your heart, thoughts, intentions and actions?

MARCH 29 | GOOD FRIDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Holy Gospel: John 18:1 - 19:42

Sanctify your servants for whom Christ your Son, by the shedding of his Blood, established the Paschal Mystery. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Stations of the Cross: "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you. Because, by your Holy Cross, you have redeemed the world." (From Stations of the Cross by Saint Alphonsus Liguori). Pray the Stations of the Cross today.

Contemplation: As Father Thomas Merton, OCSO, once wrote: "To know the cross is not merely to know our own sufferings. For the cross is the sign of salvation, and no

one is saved by his own sufferings. To know the cross is to know that we are saved by the sufferings of Christ; more, it is to know the love of Christ who underwent suffering and death in order to save us. It is, then, to know Christ. For to know his love is not merely to know the story of his love, but to experience in our spirit that we are loved by him, and that in his love the Father manifests his own love for us, through his Spirit poured forth into our hearts."



BLESSING OF EASTER FOOD BASKETS

The blessing of the Easter Basket containing the food for the first meal of Easter has been a beloved Catholic ritual for centuries among families of Eastern European origin. This tradition has since been adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds, who enjoy its rich symbolism. On Holy Saturday morning, families prepare their Easter Baskets and fill them with symbolic items. The baskets are later brought to church to be blessed during a short service in the early afternoon. After Easter Sunday's Resurrection Mass, each family and their guests share their blessed fare and exchange good wishes.

The custom of blessing the Easter foods arose from the strict Lenten fasting of the past, when meat, eggs, fats, and other foods were forbidden during Lent. Easter was thus greeted with great joy as the day when Christ arose and when fasts were ended. The Church's joy and thanksgiving were expressed in this custom of blessing the foods for the first meal of Easter.

The Christian significance of Easter is symbolized in the items used and foods chosen for this special Easter tradition. Baskets are lined with a white cloth and decorated with ribbons, flowers, and greenery to symbolize spring, renewal, and, of course, the Resurrection of Jesus.

Traditionally, the baskets are filled with: decorated hardboiled eggs (representing Christ's Resurrection); lamb-shaped butter or sugar (representing Christ as

the "Lamb of God"); bread (reminding us that Jesus is the "Bread of Life"); meats, such as ham (symbolic of great joy and abundance), sausage (symbolic of God's favor and generosity), smoked bacon (symbolic of the overabundance of God's mercy), or lamb (representing Christ as the "Lamb of God"); salt (symbolic of prosperity and justice, and reminding us that we are "the salt of the earth"); cheese (symbolizing the moderation Christians should have at all times); horseradish, pepper, oil, and vinegar (symbolic of the Passion of Christ and the bitter herbs of the Passover); and wine (symbolic of the Blood of the Lord).

The foods and other items contained in the family basket can be easily personalized, even including a sampling of any foods "given up" for Lent.

A white candle is often inserted into the basket to represent Christ as the "Light of the World."

Lastly, the basket is covered with white linen, to symbolize the shroud in which Christ's body was wrapped.

This long-honored tradition is both deeply symbolic and delightfully heart-warming. Children are eager to help prepare and decorate the family basket and proudly carry it into the church on Holy Saturday for the blessing. Some families prepare specially decorated baskets for their young children, filled with fruits, chocolate bunnies, or other treats to be blessed.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help invites you and your family to bring your unique family basket(s) to the church on Holy Saturday, March 30, at noon for a brief blessing service. Do come and share in this beloved custom with your parish family, or make this the start of a new Easter tradition with your own family, relatives, and friends!

Immediately following the basket blessing, your Knights of Columbus Council 4603 will be sponsoring an Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, March 30, at 12:30 pm. The egg hunt will take place outdoors on the church lawn.

This is a free event, and is open to all children 12 and under.

Bring your favorite basket. We will also have bags on hand for those who need one!

COMPOST IT! AT OUR LADY AND IN GROVE CITY

On Earth Day weekend this year, in keeping with Pope Francis' Laudato Si' encyclical urging all people of good will to Care for our Common Home, Our Lady's Laudato Si' Action Team will make a number of food waste composting buckets and lids available for parishioners that want to participate in their own at-home food waste composting effort. Donations will be accepted to offset the roughly \$10/bucket cost. Our Lady has embraced a vibrant food waste composting effort for a number of years as part of its overall Zero Waste initiative. Composting efforts can be seen at Fish Frys, parish events, funeral bereavement dinners, the Feast Day celebration, and the Our Lady Festival. Recently, the parish staff has extended its commitment to Zero Waste by placing green composting buckets with lids and liners in all rooms that may have food waste, alongside blue recycling bins and black landfill/ trash containers. The City of Grove City facilitates food waste compost drop-off through a partnership with GoZero, offering lime-green containers for food waste collection behind the former Brook Park Middle School/Big Splash Pool at 2803 Southwest Blvd. To ensure the success of Grove City's composting program, participants are urged to use Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) approved liners.

Here's a guide on how to participate in Grove City's food waste drop-off composting program:

- 1. Use a food-grade composting bucket and sealable lid, with BPI approved liner.
- Place only Accepted Materials in the compost bucket.
 Keep the compost bucket, with lid tightly sealed until full or up to a week.
 No need to refrigerate or keep outdoors as it is odorless and pest free if kept sealed.
- At least weekly, take the compost bucket to the food-waste collection center behind the former Brook Park Middle School/Big Splash Pool at 2803 Southwest Blvd.
- 4. Place the contents of the compost bucket, including the BPI approved liner, in the Go Zero collection bin.
- 5. Rinse bucket and lid, replace with fresh liner, and repeat!
