

# PASTOR'S CORNER

The month of April is dedicated to the Holy Spirit.

"Born as a son, led forth as a lamb, sacrificed as a sheep, buried as a man, he rose from the dead as a God, for he is by nature God and Man. He is all things: he judges, and so he is Law; he teaches, and so he is Word; he saves, and so he is Grace; he begets and so he is Father; he is begotten, and so he is Son; he suffers, and so he is Sacrifice; he is buried, and so he is man; he rises again, and so he is God. This is Jesus Christ, to Whom belongs Glory for all ages." +St. Melito of Sardis

#### THE OCTAVE OF EASTER

#### **MONDAY, APRIL 1**

Holy Gospel: Matthew 28:8-15

Prayer: O God, who give constant increase to your Church by new offspring, grant that your servants may hold fast in their lives to the Sacrament they have received in faith. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Are you always prepared to meet the Risen Lord? The disciples of Jesus were as unprepared for his Resurrection as they were for his death. The empty tomb made them fearful and joyful at the same time. "Where did they put the body or did he really rise just as he predicted?" Even though Jesus had spoken to them before of his death and rising, they could not believe until they saw the empty tomb and met the Risen Lord. Aren't we the same? We want to see with our own eyes before we believe! The guards brought their testimony to the chief priests and elders who met the news with denial. They were resolved to not believe that Jesus had risen and they bribed the guards in the hope of keeping others from believing.

#### **TUESDAY, APRIL 2**

Holy Gospel: John 20:11-18

Prayer: O God, who have bestowed on us paschal remedies, endow your people with heavenly gifts, so that, possessed of perfect freedom, they may rejoice in heaven over what gladdens them now on earth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: How easy it can be to miss the Lord when our focus is on ourselves! Mary did not at first recognize the Lord because her focus was on the empty tomb and on her own grief. It took only one word from the Master, when he called her by name, for Mary to recognize him. Mary's message to the disciples, I have seen the Lord, is

the very essence of Christianity. It is not enough that a Christian know about the Lord, but that we know him personally. It is not enough to argue about him, but to meet him. In the Resurrection, we encounter the living Lord who loves us personally and shares his glory with us. The Lord gives us "eyes of faith" to see the truth of his Resurrection and victory over sin and death (Ephesians 1:18).

#### **WEDNESDAY, APRIL 3**

Holy Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

Prayer: O God, who gladden us year by year with the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection, graciously grant that, by celebrating these present festivities, we may merit through them to reach eternal joys. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: We often wonder how it would have been difficult for the disciples to recognize the Risen Lord. To put it simply, Jesus' death scattered his disciples and shattered their hopes and dreams. They had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. They saw the cross as defeat and could not comprehend the empty tomb until the Lord appeared to them and gave them understanding. Jesus chided the disciples on the road to Emmaus for their slowness of heart to believe what the scriptures had said concerning the Messiah. They did not recognize the Risen Jesus until he had broken bread with them. Do you recognize the Lord in his word and in the breaking of the bread?

#### THURSDAY, APRIL 4

Holy Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

Prayer: O God, who have united the many nations in confessing your name, grant that those reborn in the font of Baptism may be one in the faith of their hearts and the homage of their deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: A central teaching of the gospel is the cross; but it does not stop there. Through the cross, Jesus defeated our enemies – death and Satan and won pardon for our sins. His cross is the door to heaven and the key to paradise. The way to glory is through the cross. When the disciples saw the Risen Lord they disbelieved for joy! How can death lead to life, the cross to victory? Jesus shows us the way and he gives us the power to overcome sin and despair, and everything else that would stand in the way of his love and truth. Just as the first disciples were commissioned to bring the good news of salvation to all the nations, so, we, too, are called to be witnesses of the

Resurrection of Jesus Christ to all who live on the face of the earth. Do you witness the joy of the Gospel to those around you?

#### FRIDAY, APRIL 5

Holy Gospel: John 21:1-14

Prayer: Almighty ever-living God, who gave us the Paschal Mystery in the covenant you established for reconciling the human race, so dispose our minds, we pray, that what we celebrate by professing the faith we may express in deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Skeptics who disbelieve the Resurrection say the disciples only saw a vision of Jesus. The Gospels, however, give us a vivid picture of the reality of the Resurrection. Jesus went out of his way to offer his disciples various proofs of his Resurrection – that he is

real and true flesh, not just a spirit or ghost. In his third appearance to the apostles, after Jesus performed the miraculous catch of fish, he prepared a breakfast and ate with them. Peter's prompt recognition of the Master and exclamation "It is the Lord!" stands in sharp contrast to his previous denial of his Master during the night of Jesus' arrest. The Lord Jesus reveals himself to each of us as we open our hearts to receive his word. Do you recognize the Lord's presence in your life? Do you receive his word with faith? Are you open to conforming your mind and heart to that of Jesus Christ, so that you can follow him with love as a true disciple?


#### WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP

# COMPOST IT! AT OUR LADY AND IN GROVE CITY

On Earth Day weekend this year, in keeping with Pope Francis' Laudato Si' encyclical urging all people of good will to Care for our Common Home, Our Lady's Laudato Si Action Team will make a number of food waste composting buckets and lids available for parishioners that want to participate in their own at-home food waste composting effort. Donations will be accepted to offset the roughly \$10/bucket cost.

Our Lady has embraced a vibrant food waste composting effort for a number of years as part of its overall Zero Waste initiative. Composting efforts can be seen at Fish Frys, parish events, funeral bereavement dinners, the Feast Day celebration, and the Our Lady Festival. Recently, the parish staff has extended its commitment to Zero Waste by placing green composting buckets with lids and liners in all rooms that may have food waste, alongside blue recycling bins and black landfill/trash containers.

The City of Grove City facilitates food waste compost drop-off through a partnership with GoZero, offering lime-green containers for foodwaste collection behind the former Brook Park Middle School/Big Splash Pool at 2803 Southwest Blvd. To ensure the success of Grove City's composting program, participants are urged to use Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI) approved liners.

The Save More Than Food program, launched in 2018 by SWACO and the Central Ohio Food Waste Initiative, aims to increase awareness of the substantial impact of food waste on community health and the economy. Central Ohioans currently landfill nearly a million pounds of food waste daily, equivalent to five pounds per person per week. An alarming 12.8% of all material landfilled by Franklin County residents and businesses is comprised of food waste. In 2018, the cost of landfilling this material reached over \$6 million annually for Franklin County residents and businesses. The Save More Than Food initiative is committed to reducing food waste by 50% by the year 2030, emphasizing the significant benefits for both the community and the economy.

Composting is one plank of the initiative and offers numerous benefits, including reducing waste in landfills, producing nutrient-rich soil for plant growth, decreasing reliance on chemical fertilizers, improving soil structure and water retention, conserving water, capturing carbon to mitigate climate change, supporting biodiversity, controlling erosion, saving costs, fostering community engagement, and reducing greenhouse gas emissions. It is an environmentally friendly practice that enhances soil health and promotes sustainable waste management.

# GUIDE ON HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN GROVE CITY'S FOOD WASTE DROP-OFF COMPOSTING

Residents collect food waste in a container of their choice and then at a time convenient for them, drop scraps into the GoZERO lime-green containers located behind Brookpark Middle School/Big Splash Pool at 2803 Southwest Blvd., in the rear corner of the west parking lot. GoZERO empties and cleans the containers each week.

Participants can help make Grove City's composting program successful by discarding only approved compostable materials from personal containers or using liners certified by the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI). Plastic baggies, grocery bags or trash bags should not be used.

Here's a guide on how to participate in Grove City's food waste drop-off composting program:

- 1. Use a food-grade composting bucket and sealable lid, with BPI approved liner.
- 2. Place only Accepted Materials in the compost bucket.
- 3. Keep the compost bucket, with lid tightly sealed until full or up to a week. No need to refrigerate or keep outdoors as it is odorless and pest free if kept sealed.
- 4. At least weekly, take the compost bucket to the foodwaste collection center behind the former Brook Park Middle School/Big Splash Pool at 2803 Southwest Blvd.
- 5. Place the contents of the compost bucket, including the BPI approved liner, in the Go Zero collection bin.
- 6. Rinse bucket and lid, replace with fresh liner, and repeat!

# ACCEPTED MATERIALS (FOOD WASTE ONLY)

- Meat
- Small bones
- Fruits and vegetables including beans, nuts, peels and cores
- Dairy products including milk, yogurts and cheeses
- · Eggs including shells
- · Breads, grains, cereals and pastas
- · Sauces, condiments and syrups
- · Seasonings, herbs and spices
- · Sweets and candies
- · Coffee grounds

#### **NOT ACCEPTED**

- Yard waste including leaves, wood and stone
- Pet waste
- PLU/UPC stickers
- Rubber bands, twine, twist ties or other bundling materials
- Jars, wrappers, foil, bags, tubs, trays and other plastic or Styrofoam containers
- Plastic bags and other noncompostable plastics including coatings and films
- Metal including cans and aluminum foil

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb

he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first

For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed.


