

PASTOR'S CORNER

The month of April is dedicated to the Holy Spirit.

SEASON OF EASTER

MONDAY, APRIL 8 | SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

Holy Gospel: Luke 1:26-38

Prayer: O God, who willed that your Word should take on the reality of human flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary, grant, we pray, that we, who confess our Redeemer to be God and man, may merit to become partakers even in his divine nature. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: When the word of God is delivered by the angel Gabriel to Mary, she knows she is hearing something beyond human capability. It will surely take a miracle which surpasses all that God has done previously. Her question, "how shall this be, since I have no husband" is not prompted by doubt or skepticism, but by wonderment! She is a true hearer of the Word and she immediately responds with faith and trust. Mary's prompt response of "yes" to the divine message is a model of faith for all believers. Mary believed God's promises even when they seemed impossible. She was full of grace because she trusted that what God said was true and would be fulfilled. She was willing and eager to do God's will, even if it seemed difficult or costly. God gives us grace and he expects us to respond with the same willingness, obedience, and heartfelt trust as Mary did. When God commands he also gives the help, strength, and means to respond. We can either yield to his grace or resist and go our own way. Do you believe in God's promises? Do you yield to his grace?

TUESDAY, APRIL 9

Holy Gospel: John 3:7b-15

Prayer: Enable us, we pray, almighty God, to proclaim the power of the risen Lord, that we, who have received the pledge of his gift, may come to possess all he gives when it is fully revealed. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: The bronze serpent points to the cross of Christ which defeats sin and death and obtains everlasting life for those who believe. The result of Jesus "being lifted up on the cross" and his rising and exaltation to the Father's right hand in heaven, is our "new birth in the Spirit" and adoption as sons and daughters of God. God not only redeems us, but he fills us with his own divine life and power that we might share in his glory. Jesus gives us the Holy Spirit that we may have power to be his witnesses and to spread and defend the gospel by word and action, and to never be ashamed of the Cross of Christ. The Holy Spirit gives us his seven-fold gifts of wisdom and understanding, right judgment and courage, knowledge and reverence for God and his ways, and a holy fear in God's presence (ref. Isaiah 11) that we may live for God and serve him in the power of his strength. Do you thirst for new life in the Spirit?

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 10

Holy Gospel: John 3:16-21

Prayer: As we recall year by year the mysteries by which, through the restoration of its original dignity, human nature has received the hope of rising again, we earnestly beseech your mercy, Lord, that what we celebrate in faith we may possess in unending love. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Jesus shows us the paradox of love and judgment. We can love the darkness of sin and unbelief or we can love the light of God's truth, beauty, and goodness. This all takes place by the choices we make – our "free will." If our love is guided by what is true, and good and beautiful then we will choose for God and love him above all else. What we love shows what we prefer. Do you love God above all else? Does he take first place in your life, in your thoughts, and actions? Are your choices guided by the love of God? If not, why not?

THURSDAY, APRIL 11 | ST. STANISLAUS

Holy Gospel: John 3:31-36

Prayer: O God, restorer and lover of innocence, direct the hearts of your servants towards yourself, that those you have set free from the darkness of unbelief may never stray from the light of your truth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Prayer (Saint Stanislaus): O God, for whose honor the Bishop Saint Stanislaus fell beneath the swords of his persecutors, grant we pray, that we may persevere strong in faith even until death. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Contemplation: Do you hunger for the true life which

God offers through the gift of his Holy Spirit? The Jews understood that God gave a certain portion of his Spirit to his prophets. When Elijah was about to depart for heaven, his servant Elisha asked for a double portion of the Spirit (2 Kings 2:9). Jesus tells his disciples that they can believe the words he speaks because God the Father has poured his Spirit on him in full measure, without keeping anything back. The function of the Holy Spirit is to reveal God's truth to us. When we receive the Holy Spirit he enables us to recognize and understand God's truth. Jesus is the Word of God and he gives us his Holy Spirit so that we can recognize his truth and live according to it.

FRIDAY, APRIL 12


Holy Gospel: John 6:1-15

Prayer: O God, who for the salvation of the world brought about the paschal sacrifice, be favorable to the supplications of your people, so that Christ our High Priest, interceding on our behalf, may by his likeness to ourselves bring us reconciliation, and by his equality with you free us from our sins. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy

Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: The feeding of the five thousand shows the remarkable generosity of God and his great kindness towards us. When God gives, he gives abundantly. He gives more than we need for ourselves that we may have something to share with others, especially those who lack what they need. God takes the little we have and multiplies it for the good of others. Do you trust in God's provision for you? Do you share freely with others, especially those who lack even the most basic necessities, such as food and clothing? How about doing some spring cleaning, and take what you're not using in your home (items that are clean and in good condition, of course) and give them to any number of Catholic organizations reaching out to help those in need – especially our Saint Vincent de Paul Chapter.



REUSABLE GROCERY BAGS

The theme for Earth Day 2024 revolves around "Healing Our Throwaway Culture: Focus on Plastics." One simple yet effective way to contribute to this cause is by reusing or recycling grocery bags, thereby lessening the harmful impact of single-use plastic disposal in landfills.

During this Earth Day weekend, echoing the sentiments of Pope Francis' Laudato Si' encyclical, which calls upon all individuals of goodwill to Care for our Common Home, Our Lady's Laudato Si Action Team will distribute reusable grocery bags to families. Each bag, adorned with Our Lady's logo, serves to raise awareness and promote the reduction of single-use plastic bag consumption. Donations will be accepted to offset the roughly \$3/bag cost.

What sets these reusable bags apart is their unique design. Featuring Our Lady's branding, they can be conveniently folded into a self-storing pouch, allowing them to be easily tucked away in purses, car door pockets, or glove compartments. Over the past five decades, global plastic production has undergone a remarkable doubling. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the manufacture of plastic goods consumes about 4-8 percent of the world's oil output. Addressing the plastic crisis is imperative if we are to enhance air and oceanic health, and safeguard both biodiversity and human well-being.



Consider this: disposable plastic bags are typically utilized for a mere 12 minutes

before being discarded, contributing to a global recycling rate of less than 3%. The astonishing reality is that every second, approximately 160,000 plastic bags are consumed worldwide, amounting to a staggering five trillion annually. However, their environmental repercussions persist for centuries due to slow decomposition, with all unrecycled or unincinerated bags ever produced still in existence. It takes multiple generations for a single-use plastic bag to disintegrate into smaller particles known as microplastics, which then can infiltrate ecosystems and adversely affect both terrestrial and aquatic habitats.

Americans alone discard roughly 1 billion single-use plastic bags each year, ranking them among the top 10 items found in coastal clean-ups. Plastic debris poses a threat to over 260 marine species, leading to harm through asphyxiation or complications from plastic ingestion. An alarming statistic indicates that 85% of sea turtles are projected to sustain injuries or fatalities due to plastics during their lifetimes. And 80% of marine litter originates from land-based refuse, with the East Coast of the United States serving as a primary contributor to the North Atlantic Garbage Patch.

The sobering forecast is that, without intervention, the amount of plastic in the ocean could surpass that of fish by 2050. Despite these disheartening figures, there is room for optimism. Each individual who switches to reusable or recycled bags has the potential to prevent thousands of plastic bags from entering the environment. When opting for reusables, it's crucial to consider their environmental footprint and the number of uses needed to offset higher production costs. Regardless of the bag's material—whether plastic, paper,

or otherwise—the most sustainable choice is the one you already possess. By maximizing its usage and then responsibly recycling it, you can significantly diminish its environmental impact. What if you find yourself without a reusable bag? Recycle them! While most residential curbside recycling programs typically accept items like plastic bottles, paper, and cardboard, plastic bags require special handling due to their lightweight and flexible nature, which can pose challenges in traditional recycling systems.

HERE'S A GUIDE TO EFFECTIVELY RECYCLING PLASTIC BAGS:

- 1. Prepare the bags for recycling by removing any non-plastic items such as receipts or stickers, as these can disrupt the recycling process. Flatten the bags to save space and facilitate transportation.
- Take your clean and dry plastic bags to designated drop-off locations at grocery stores, retailers, or dedicated recycling centers specifically equipped to handle plastic bags. Look for labeled bins or containers where you can deposit them.
- Kroger accepts various types of plastic, including grocery bags, bubble wrap, plastic overwrap from paper towels, cereal box liners, bread bags, dry cleaning bags, produce bags, newspaper sleeves, and plastic shipping envelopes. Look for their special Zero Hunger | Zero Waste bins located at the front of their stores.
- Giant Eagle also welcomes plastic grocery bags, bubble wrap, air pillows, plastic shipping envelopes, newspaper sleeves, bread loaf bags, produce wrap, grocery produce bags, bulk water bottle packaging, as well as paper towel and toilet paper case wrap.

In his encyclical Laudato Si', Pope Francis frequently emphasizes the necessity of an "ecological conversion" to confront the environmental issues confronting our planet. He references the Bishops of the United States, who suggest that "our care for one another and our care for the earth are intimately bound together." As custodians entrusted by God with the stewardship of this remarkable planet, let us commit ourselves wholeheartedly to the care of all creation.


